## RE: Docket (FDA-2024-N-1809) Listening Session: Optimizing FDA's Use of and Process for Advisory Committees

The undersigned members of the Food and Beverage Issue Alliance (FBIA) appreciate the opportunity to provide comments to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA or Agency) regarding Listening Session: Optimizing FDA's Use of and Process for Advisory Committees, Docket FDA-2024-1809. FBIA is a coalition of over 45 allied U.S.-based food and beverage trade associations representing various parts of the supply chain, from farmers and agricultural processors, to packaged goods and retail.

We appreciate the FDA's efforts to ensure that advisory committees provide independent advice on scientific, technical, and policy matters to support the Agency's goal to protect and promote public health. To ensure policy decisions are well informed in a manner that appropriately considers the multidisciplinary aspects of food safety and nutrition to protect public health, it is critical that FDA reinstate its Food Advisory Committee (FAC or Committee).

The FAC provided invaluable insights and guidance on many food-related issues, drawing upon the expertise of subject matter experts (SMEs) across various disciplines. For example, FDA convened the FAC to consider the available relevant data on consumption of synthetic color additives in food and adverse effects on behavior<sup>1</sup>, policies related to the presence of *Listeria monocytogenes* in ready-to-eat foods<sup>2</sup>, and detection of chemical hazards in foods<sup>3</sup>, among others. The reinstatement of the FAC would ensure that the FDA continues to benefit from the comprehensive, specialized knowledge necessary for informed decision making.

To maximize the effectiveness of the FAC, we propose that the Committee change the SMEs who serve based on the specific food-related issue under consideration. This flexible approach would ensure that the FDA benefits from the most relevant and specialized knowledge for each topic. For example, when evaluating the safety and efficacy of food additives, it is imperative to include experts who specialize in toxicology and chemical safety. When addressing issues related to foodborne pathogens, food scientists, microbiologists, and/or epidemiologists, with expertise in infection control should be consulted. Nutrition experts can address concerns related to diet and nutrition, including obesity, diabetes, and other diet-related conditions. This targeted selection of SMEs would enhance the quality of the committee's recommendations and ensure that all relevant aspects are thoroughly examined.
